

IMPERIAL BEIJING


Post-Conference Itinerary

BEIJING

4 days / 1 domestic flights







Beijing is defined by an architectural axis that runs from Qianmen Gate, through the grand halls of the Forbidden City, to Jingshan Hill. This is the center of the Chinese universe. For four days, experience the grandeur of the capital city that has radiated imperial power since the Yuan Dynasty.

ITINERARY

August 22 • XIAN – BEIJING

Transit to the airport and board our morning flight to Beijing.

Upon arrival, we explore the Temple of Heaven, one of the finest creations of the Ming Dynasty.

Next, enjoy a walking/shopping tour of the newly redeveloped Qianmen district. This emporium was designed on the traditional storefronts that once made this area the heart of Beijing cultural and commercial life.

Later, check in the Beijing Capital Hotel.

Then, admire the new National Grand Theater, lovingly dubbed the "Big Egg."

This evening, savor the imperial city's most famous delicacy, Peking duck, at the renowned Da Dong Restaurant.

After dinner, we'll stroll to nearby Tiananmen Square or Wangfujing street. (L,D)

Breakfast (B), Lunch (L) and Dinner (D) are included in the day's program.

August 23 • BEIJING

This morning, we enter the gate of the immense complex known as the Forbidden City, the abiding symbol of imperial China. Marvel at its expansive architecture, magnificent imperial gardens, and many museums of Chinese antiquities and treasures.

In the afternoon, visit the Summer Palace, the astounding imperial pleasure garden built in 1888 and laid out on a grand scale.

We'll have the opertunity to learn how Chinese cloisonné is made.

Then, tour the new stadiums made famous by the 2008 Beijing Olympics, the "Bird's Nest" and "Water Cube."

This evening is at leisure you may choose to explore the Legation District for dinner on one's own. (B,L)

August 24 • BEIJING

An optional early–morning walk to Changpuhe Park offers an opportunity to observe local residents practicing taiji and qigong.

Then, explore Beijing's picturesque Houhai district, where well-preserved courtyard homes and narrow hutong alleys border tree-lined lakes. We divide into small groups and enjoy lunch at the homes of local families.

In the afternoon we head north from Beijing for the Great Wall of China. As is usually the case, the Great Wall presents a visual experience that dramatically exceeds visitors' expectations.

If time allows, we visit "Silk Alley," a shopping center wildly popular with Beijing expatriates for its high quality silk products at amazingly cheap prices.

After dinner there will be a Peking Opera performance, always an audience favorite. (B,L,D)

August 25 • BEIJING

This morning is free for personal exploration. An optional visit is available to Yonghegong, the lama temple in north Beijing. The giant statue of Guanyin is the largest wood sculpture in the world and well worth the effort to see.

Independent travelers depart Beijing on their own. (B)

August 22 - 27

IDYLLIC SOUTHERN CHINA

Post-Conference Itinerary

HANGZHOU • SUZHOU • SHANGHAI

6 days / 1 domestic flight / 1 motor coach



"South of the Yangzi" is the phrase used to describe the southern way of life. And Hangzhou and Suzhou represent the highest achievement of southern sophistication. Here we delight in the lakes and canals that serve as backdrop for gorgeous traditional gardens, pavilions, temples, and mansions that realize the "southern style."

ITINERARY

August 22 • XIAN – HANGZHOU

Today we fly to Hangzhou and check in the Shangri-la Hotel on West Lake. Hangzhou is the most idyllic ancient city in China.

First, explore Guozhuang Garden, an unusually well-preserved family manor featuring magnificent pavilions and gardens. Stop by the lovely Quyuanfenghe Park and continue our walking tour on the famous Su Causeway.

Before dinner, tour the grand architectural compound of the Qing Dynasty merchant, Hu Xueyan. (L,D)

Breakfast (B), Lunch (L) and Dinner (D) are included in the day's program.

August 23 • HANGZHOU

In the morning we tour Huagang Park, sauntering among its exotic trees, flowers, and fish ponds.

Visit the National Silk Museum followed by an exploration of Maojiawu Tea Plantation. Meet with tea farmers who continue cultivating the famous longjing tea. Later, visit the Buddhist Lingyin Temple, one of the grand temples of China today.

We end the day with a sunset boat cruise to the elegant Santanjingyue Isle in the middle of the West Lake.

Dinner is at is at the famous Waipojia Restaurant. (B,L,D)

August 24 • SUZHOU

After breakfast travel to Suzhou—a three hour drive. It is also the heart of south China's traditional garden culture, known for its elegance and sophistication. Upon arrival, check in the Sofitel Hotel.

Enjoy the Humble Administrator's Garden with its countless pavilions offering views onto lakes and greenery.

Not to be missed is I. M. Pei's latest creation, the new Suzhou Museum.

After lunch visit Lingering Garden, Suzhou's most famous garden, with its eccentric architecture and winding paths. If time allows, visit the Suzhou embroidery Institute to learn of this marvelous artwork.

Then listen to the evocative traditional music in the many pavilions of Master of the Nets Garden. (B,L,D)

August 25 • SHANGHAI

After breakfast, drive to Shanghai and check in the Shanghai Central Hotel.

Then go to Yuyuan Gardens, designed in six unique parts, making the garden seem much larger than it really is.

Next we explore Xintiandi—a stylish restaurant and shopping district. Enjoy dinner on one's own. (B,L)

August 26 • SHANGHAI

We divert ourselves among the wonderful collections of the Shanghai Museum.

Then, step into new China at the Pudong Economic Zone, with its spectacular skyscrapers reshaping the horizon.

Lunch is at the fabulous Lu Bo Lang Restaurant.

We'll enjoy a spectacular bird's-eye view of Shanghai from the 100th floor observatory deck of the Shanghai World Financial Centre. After dinner, we'll stroll along the Bund, viewing the beautifully illuminated colonial buildings along the Huangpu River. (B,L,D)

August 27 • SHANGHAI

After breakfast independent travelers depart Shanghai on their own. (B)

TRAVEL IN CHINA

China's tourism industry has improved dramatically over the last decade. However, air and land transportation and other facilities may not always meet international standards. In addition, your hosts want to show you as much of their country as possible, so the schedule will be demanding with moderate physical activity. Travel in China requires good physical condition and health (special needs must be arranged for in advance and may result in additional costs), a spirit of adventure, a flexible attitude and a sense of humor. The itinerary is subject to change and modification. Every effort will be made to carry out the program as planned, but alterations may still occur. Participants should be aware that no refunds will be made as a result of unforeseen changes, modifications, or delays.

MEALS

China offers a wide variety of dining experiences and this program will take advantage of a broad range of Chinese food including Shanghai, Hunan, Sichuan, Canton, and Imperial regional cuisines. Special diets are not possible, except to the extent one picks and chooses from the many dishes served.

CONDITIONS

Reservations: Bookings are subject to the terms and conditions mentioned in these sections. A contract has been entered into as soon as your booking is received and accepted. To confirm the reservation, please fill out the reservation form and submit full payment, either by check or credit card.

TERMS & CONDITIONS

Air: Please note that for any additional and individual air bookings, all sales are final with no exchanges or refunds.

Cancellations: <u>Tour cancellations must be made in writing to China Advocates</u>, Inc., as soon as the decision is made.

Cancellation penalties based on the date of receipt of written notice are as follows:

91 or more days prior to departure, a cancellation fee of 30% of total cost is retained; 90-50 days prior to departure, 50% of total cost; 49-0 days prior to departure, no refund is made.

Cancellation penalties for air upgrades, additional hotel nights, hotel and room upgrades, tours and any special arrangements, are as follows: 50-31 days prior to departure, 50% of total cost; 30-0 days prior to departure, no refund is made.

Responsibilities: China Advocates, Inc. acts only as an agent for the various carriers for which tickets are provided and assumes no responsibility or liability in connection with the service of any train, vessel, carriage, aircraft, motor vehicle or other conveyance which may be used either wholly or in part, in the performance of their duty to the passenger. In the event it becomes necessary or advisable for the comfort or well being of the travelers, or for any reason whatsoever, to alter itinerary or arrangements, such alterations may be made without penalty to the operators. The right is reserved to withdraw any or all tours should conditions warrant, also to decline to accept or retain any travelers as members for the tours. In such instances, full or equitable amounts will be refunded. Registration as a seller of travel does not constitute approval by the State of California. All legal questions will be settled within the jurisdiction of the County of San Francisco, California.

Documentation: To obtain a Chinese visa, a passport is required that is valid for at least 6 months beyond the duration of the tour.

Trip cancellation insurance is highly recommended and available. You will receive travel insurance information once you are confirmed on the program.

Tour itneraries are subject to modification. Prices are current as of January 2009 and are subject to change without notice.
